So streamlined and comfortable is **COVER** clothing, you hardly remember it offers a sun protection factor of 50. The 12-piece collection is the brainchild of Dallasites Lisa Moore and Robyn Stevens, who wanted clothes that would be stylish in the water, on the court or at the grocery -- and offer more protection from damaging UVA and UVB rays than a standard-issue cotton T.

"The hardest thing was the fabric," says Stevens, a former model and *Young and the Restless* regular. "Since we're using only one fabric, it had to be perfect." They settled on a fast-drying nylon spandex originally created for swimsuits. The material has the softness and drape of cotton jersey, perfect for the range of hooded tunics, miniskirts, draped jackets and patio dresses.

Cover is available only at LA's Shop Intuition and [shopintuition.com](http://shopintuition.com). But the partners hope to bring it to Dallas soon. More importantly, says Moore, "We want to start a sun-protection trend."
